In the beginning of the school year, we were told by the principal that there were not any extra monies available for purchasing add-ons. The language arts curriculum director was contacted about funding other things such as books on CD and individual CD players, which is more in his budget, since this is for one school only.

Section 3: Project Description:

By January 1, 2011, the website Bookflix will have been ordered and available to all K-3 students at North Woods International. The access to this website, which pairs a nonfiction text with a fiction text, will aid approximately 250 students at North Woods International with reading and interpreting informational text. All books available on this site can be read to the student or the student can do his or her own reading. Students also have the ability to gain vocabulary understanding while using this website. By holding the cursor over a word, students can immediately read or listen to the word's definition. After listening or reading a text, students can

participate in a quiz or an activity that coincides with the book's content and or vocabulary. This resource will benefit teachers by providing another avenue for students to work on the new Common Core standards especially in the area of reading informational text. Bookflix will also be available for parents and children at home. Listening to reading is beneficial for developing children's accuracy and fluency. In a technology based society, this tool will be a motivator for today's child.

Bookflix, a website provided through Scholastic, pairs a nonfiction book with a fiction book. Books are available on the following topics: animals and nature, earth and sky, people and places, ABC's and 1,2, 3's, family and community, music and rhyme, adventure, celebrations, and imagination. Reading informational text is an important life skill and a huge component of our new Common Core Language Arts Standards. One whole standard is devoted to reading informational text. In the early grades, it is harder to find nonfiction texts at appropriate reading levels. Bookflix provides the teacher and the student with quality nonfiction literature at the appropriate levels. The books can either be read on one's own or read to the student. Students, if they choose, can even watch the story in video format. This website fulfills the digital child's needs and maintains his or her attention for longer periods of time. Listening to reading is an essential part of a young reader's growth. Funding this project will give approximately 250 students access to quality nonfiction literature that can be used at school and at home. Who could argue with those numbers?
