#### **Guidelines**

- Grants must serve the students in the School District of La Crosse.
- Projects must be innovative, creative and new funding initiatives within the School District of La Crosse.
- The grant may be denied if another funding source might be more appropriate.
- Project funds must be spent by May of 2012.
- Interim and final reports will be required.
- Payments for services of La Crosse School District employees are prohibited.

#### Criteria

Applications will be reviewed on a competitive basis by the Grants Committee of the La Crosse Public Education Foundation. Priority is given for Classroom Innovation Grants that:

- meet multiple educational objectives
- align with district/school/curricular goals
- impact a variety of students and/or schools
- are collaborative
- are sustainable

Please see the Classroom Innovation Grant evaluation rubric for the grant proposal evaluation criteria. Although most applications are worthy of awarding, the committee has limited funding and must set priorities that help the foundation fulfill its mission.

The Success in Seven will be a new curriculum unit added into the Success Center, and will be used throughout the school year. The project will be able to be implemented each year. The school is also looking at offering a summer school opportunity for students that are "At-Risk" the Success in Seven curriculum will also be utilized during this time.

V. Approximately how many students will be affected by this project? Explain your number. Currently, there are five periods of Success Center that is being offered during the day; classes range from 27-30 students. Some students enter the Success Center and learn the skills needed to increase their success and then transition out of the course, while others will be added to the roster if they are not finding success throughout the school year. The total number of students impacted by this program would range from 150-175 students.

Collaboration is the key to the success of this program. Weekly and in some cases daily communication with classroom teachers need to occur to identify the areas of need for the student to work on. Required resource time attendance will need to be communicated to students and staff members throughout the building. The activities and time spent in the Success Center are geared to help improve the students performance in all classes attended throughout the day, so in theory this program could affect all teachers in the school.

What will happen to the project at the conclusion of the grant? If it is to continue, how will it be sustained?

The Success Center has been in place for fourteen years and will continue to be an integral part of Central as long as students are identified as "at-risk." The equipment that is purchased through this grant are products that can be used to implement the curriculum in the future and will not need to be replaced. Adventure based and active learning equipment will be able to be used and maintained for many years, and in the event that the products need to be replaced the Success Center budget will be able to purchase replacement equipment.

VIII. How could the project be shared with other teachers and schools to benefit more students?

Adventure based and action learning is geared for all learners. With that said, this equipment can be utilized in all classrooms throughout the district. Central has created a collaboration schedule to encourage teachers to communicate throughout the school and increase learning. During this time activities could be modeled to other staff members so that they could also utilize the materials in their classrooms. Due the nature of the Success Center the students that are targeted are the lower performers in the school, through the use of the collaboration time teachers that are working with the other students in the school can implement the adventure and active learning principles.

Although, the Success Center only reaches eight percent of the student population at Central, it is these students that potentially could be burdens on the community because they were unable to meet the demands of high school. This makes reaching this population even more important for the district and specifically Central. These funds will enhance the daily learning experiences that students enrolled in the Success Center will experience while attending school. Celebrating successes that students experience will create a learning environment that is enjoyable to participate in; thus increasing their attendance, motivation and self-esteem. In turn, the Success in Seven could potentially increase the graduation rate potential from this group of students.
